

ANNOUNCEMENT

The project *Project Environmental Governance in Context* is running a rolling call for **BSc/MSc thesis research proposal on:**

- A) Environmental justice & role of ENGOS in environmental disputes
- B) Multilevel governance in the European context
- C) Boomeranging strategies and environmental
- D) Use of scientific knowledge by ENGO as part to mobilisation strategies.

Eligibility and minimal requirements

This call is open for students who are currently enrolled at BSc / MSc study programs at Södertörn University (Sweden), or at partner organizations in Italy, Slovenia, or Croatia, and are interested to undertake and complete a thesis research project on the above stated subject areas. This project supports empirical research on selected cases in Central and Eastern Europe.

Candidates must be at the final year of their studies and be able to speak and write in good English. For those interested to undertake empirical cases abroad fluency with the foreign language is a requirement. It is expected this collaboration will result into a successfully submitted and defended thesis and where appropriate/possible also in a working paper of a publishable quality.

The **thesis** needs to be written in compliance with guidelines as in place at the faculty where the student is currently enrolled. This includes rules regulating language for the write-up, ethics of research conduct with human subjects, data collection protocols and data use.

Supervisory arrangement will also follow protocols as set in place at the given Faculty. For students coming on a visiting research stay to Södertörn University under an Erasmus agreement this commonly involves a requirement for a main supervisor affiliated with their home university, with a local co-supervisor at Södertörn Uni. Duties over student supervision for this project are with the project coordinator, dr. Rodela from Södertörn University,

Some important deadlines and steps:

This is a rolling call and expressions of interest can be submitted every spring term.

Preliminary agreements are set in place within June, and later planned over autumn term.

Thesis proposal are to be finalised & submitted by December.

Data collection needs to be completed by March and analysed by April.

Thesis needs to be completed and handed in by last week of May.
